Notes

Monday - Practise adding one to make numbers up to 10. Watch the Numberblocks episode about adding one.

https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08q39b4/numberblocks-series-2-just-add-one Use objects from around the house to act this out as you rewatch it. E.g. begin with one car. as the numbers increase, keep adding 'one more'. How many do they have now? Use the vocabulary of 'one more' and 'add one'.

Tuesday - Re-watch yesterday's Numberblocks episode. Then practise finding the answers to the following calculations by adding one. You should use objects e.g. cars or blocks to help you if you need to. If you manage to complete this, why don't you try and make some of your own adding one questions for a grown up?

Get some objects from around your house e.g. blocks, cars, dolls. Count out 10 toys. Investigate different ways they can be split into two groups – 9 & 1, 8 & 2, 7 & 3, 6 & 4, 5 & 5. Use the pictures on this page to help you. Maybe you could write these down as number sentences or record what you have done using pictures.

Thursday - https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b08g3zx7/numberblocks-series-2-blast-off Re-watch yesterday's Numberblocks episode about number bonds to 10. Play a partner game to practise recalling these number bonds. Find a coat hanger and 10 pegs. Put your 10 pegs on the coat hanger. One person closes their eyes whilst the other person takes some pegs off the coat hanger and hides them behind their back. The other player then opens their eyes and counts the number of pegs left on the coat hanger. Can they work out how many pegs have been taken off? Repeat using different numbers to reinforce the different number bonds to 10 - 9 & 1, 8 & 2, 7 & 3, 6 & 4, 5 & 5.
