


Notes

Monday -

Revisit the 'ar' digraph. Please go to the following weblink: <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zvq9bdm/articles/zh9q92p> Here you will find a video to help you to revise the 'ar' digraph. Please watch the video and complete the quiz that follows it to apply the 'ar' digraph to different words.

Tuesday -

Continue your learning about the 'ar' digraph. Play Buried Treasure to practise reading words containing 'ar'. Go to <https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/> and log in using the username: march20 and password: home. Click on resources, then click on the game Buried Treasure. Press 'phase 3' then click '+ar'. Your child can then read the words and sort them into the treasure box if they are real, or the bin if they are a made up word. Encourage your child to locate the 'ar' digraph first to make reading easier.

Wednesday -

Today we are practising our tricky words. Remember these are words that we can't segment and blend, we just have to learn what they look like. Watch this song and see if you can join in with singing the tricky words: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=R087IYrRpgY> Make word cards for the words that feature in the video (you will need two of each word)- me, be, you, are, was, all, they, my. Mix the cards up and put them face down so you can't see the words on the cards. Take turns to turn over two cards to try and find a matching pair of words. If you can read the matching pair you can keep them. The player with the most matching pairs of words at the end of the game is the winner.

Thursday -

Write the following words on separate pieces of paper: fork, morning, born, torn, horn, short, north, porch. Hide them around the room or your garden for your child to find and then read. Encourage them to look for the 'or' digraph (and any other digraphs in the word) first to make reading easier.



Friday – Continue your learning about the ‘or’ digraph. Watch this Geraldine Giraffe video to revise this digraph. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Fm9PRHDJlv4> Once you have watched the video why don’t you try to be like Geraldine and have a look around your house for things you can find that contain the ‘or’ sound? You could even write a list of the different things you can find.
