Monday –

Revisit the 'or' digraph. Please go to the following weblink:

Here you will find a video to help you to revise the 'ur' digraph. Please watch the video and complete the quiz that follows it to apply the 'ur' digraph to different words.

Tuesday –

Continue your learning about the 'ur' digraph. Play Dragon's Den to practise reading words containing 'ur'. Go to <https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/> and log in using the username: march20 and password: home. Click on resources, then click on the game Picnic on Pluto. Press 'phase 3' then click '+ur'. Your child can then read the words and sort them onto Bob if they are real, or Obb if they are a made up word. Encourage your child to locate the 'ur' digraph first to make reading easier.

Wednesday –

Today we are practising our tricky words. Remember these are words that we can't segment and blend, we just have to learn what they look like. Grown ups, have a look at this video for some fantastic ideas of different (and fun) ways you can practise reading and writing these words outdoors

Thursday – Watch this week’s segmenting and blending practice video which introduces the ‘ow’ digraph. This will ‘go live’ on Tapestry on Thursday morning. Join in with segmenting and blending the words along with me. Write the following words on separate pieces of paper: cow, owl, gown, town, howl, wow. Hide them around the room or your garden for your child to find and then read. Encourage them to look for the ‘ow’ digraph (and any other digraphs in the word) first to make reading easier.

Friday –

Continue your learning about the ‘ow’ digraph. Watch this online phonics lesson and try to join in with the reading and writing activities. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MIXcQTgY290> Make sure you have your karate moves ready for the first game!
