Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

**Developing** Match the sentence to the correct tense when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular verbs within single clause sentences.

**Expected** Match the sentence to the correct tense when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within single and multi-clause sentences.

**Greater Depth** Match the sentence to the correct tense when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within multi-clause sentences. Some sentences are in the negative form and some include adverbs between the auxiliary verb and past participle.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

**Developing** Insert the appropriate verb form into each sentence when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular verbs within single clause sentences.

**Expected** Insert the appropriate verb form into each sentence when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within single and multi-clause sentences.

**Greater Depth** Insert the appropriate verb form into each sentence when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within multi-clause sentences where parts of the verb are sometimes omitted. Some sentences are in the negative form and some include adverbs between the auxiliary verb and past participle.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

**Developing** Explain who has identified the tense of the sentence correctly when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular verbs within single clause sentences.

**Expected** Explain who has identified the tense of the sentence correctly when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within single and multi-clause sentences.

**Greater Depth** Explain who has identified the tense of the sentence correctly when recognising the past, present and future perfect tenses of regular and irregular verbs within multi-clause sentences. Some sentences include adverbs between the auxiliary verb and past participle.

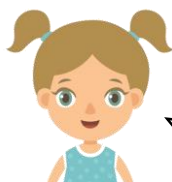
