### The School will:

- Maintain a high standard of education

- Provide opportunities for parents to speak to teachers to discuss the progress and well-being of their child
- Provide an annual written report on the achievement and progress of each child

### As Parents/Carers, we will:

- Make sure that our child arrives at school on time at 8.45am
- Make sure that our child wears school uniform, including PE kit, and black shoes
- Support our child with their homework tasks, and read regularly with them at home
- Support and work with the school in any behaviour management systems
- Let the school know of any concerns that may affect our child's work or behaviour at school
- Read and act upon any information sent home
- Keep the school informed of any changes of address, phone number or circumstance
- Collect our child promptly at 3.30pm
- Let the school know of any reasons for absence or lateness
- Ensure our child uses the internet safely

### As Pupils, we will:

- Follow the School and Class Rules to make sure our school is a happy and safe place to be
- Try always do our best
- Follow instructions straight away
- Be kind and considerate of others
- Keep hands, feet and objects to ourselves
- Look after our school and our environment
- Move sensibly around our school
- Understand that we have a choice of how to behave. By making the right choice we can earn a reward. By making the wrong choice we will lose playtime, have a phone call home or face other consequences
- Make sure that we take all letters home
