RE: Life in the Risen Jesus. Show an understanding of the meaning of the Resurrection, of Jesus' teaching on prayer and understand religious signs and actions used in prayer.

Maths: Perimeter and area: Calculate the perimeter and area of polygons, quadrilaterals and compound shapes.

Statistics: Draw, read and interpret line graphs and tables.

Shape: Classify, measure and estimate angles using degrees, calculate angles around a point or on a straight line, find lengths and angles in shapes, recognise regular and irregular polygons and 3-D shapes.

Position and Direction: Read, plot, translate and reflect coordinates. Recognise lines of symmetry.

PE: PE is every Tuesday.

English: 'The Lost Book of Adventure'. Children will write a survival narrative & a survival guide, covering and applying their knowledge of year 5 writing objectives.

PSHE: Relationships

Guided Reading: Read and comprehend fiction and non-fiction texts about North & South America/World.

Science: Animals including humans Describe the changes as humans develop to old age.

Geography: North America: children will identify the countries of North America, investigate and compare climates, explore and compare physical geographical features, capital cities, various time zones of North America and how these compare to other time zones around the world. We will compare a region in the UK with a region in North America.

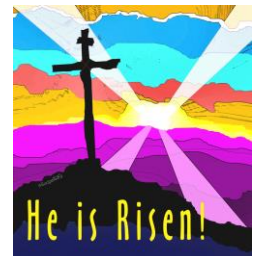
Religious Education Curriculum Directory
